

Quiet Firmness Features Market

By Elmer C. Walzer (United Press Financial Editor) New York, April 21 (UP)—Quiet firmness prevailed on the stock market today after yesterday's technical recovery.

Portland, April 21 (UP)—The butter trade on the Portland dairy market was pleased today with reports of an impending cut in ration points for butter, although feeling there may be a slackening off in purchases pending the new order.

The egg market held firmly with prices maintained. More turkeys were needed, while prices held well for live and dressed chickens.

Prices on dairy products: Butter—Cube 93 score 42 1/2 c 89 score 42 1/4 c; 90 score 42 c; 92 score 41 3/4 c.

Eggs—WFA procurement prices, No. 1 grade A large 37c; No. 2 36 1/2 c; grade A medium 32c.

PINE ORDERS GAIN Portland, April 21 (UP)—The Western Pine Association today issued the following report for the week ended April 15 of comparative figures on lumber orders, shipments and production, based on information from 106 identical mills:

Orders for western pine lumber totaled 76,786,000 feet as compared with 71,693 feet for the previous week and 84,527,000 feet for the corresponding week last year.

Similar comparisons of shipments are: 67,708,000 feet, 73,382,000 feet and 70,536,000 feet, and of production are: 66,532,000 feet, 64,379,000 feet and 64,243,000 feet.

Covered Wooden Spans Stand Floods and Time New York (UP)—Almost impervious to time and flood, 254 covered wooden bridges remain on the Pennsylvania department of highway's system, according to Secretary John U. Shroyer.

Of virgin pine, "nailed" together with wooden pins, most of the bridges have a safe carrying capacity of only two to three tons, Shroyer said in the current issue of the Engineering News-Record. The oldest of them, Northbrook bridge across the west branch of Brandywine creek in Pocopson-West Bradford township, was built in 1807.

Because they were built on a slight elevation, the bridges are little affected by flood waters, which flow around them and over the road approaches.

Officer Reviews Juvenile Problem Commenting today on correction of juvenile delinquency problems in Deschutes county, I. M. Wells, juvenile officer, who replaced Byron Lee April 1, drew on a discussion of the problem which he presented to members of the Redmond chamber of commerce Tuesday, in which he pointed out that delinquent children are the problems of all parents—and not just mothers and fathers of children who have got into difficulties. "Boys and girls who are models of good behavior and citizenship may come under the influence of those whose care has been neglected by their parents," he pointed out to the group.

Problem Outlined Wells stated that the public's responsibility is two-fold—the understanding of delinquency problems and how they should be handled in the home, and the provision of wholesome places where children may expend their natural energy. The juvenile authority's point on the limitation placed on officers by law in relation to disposition of wayward children under 14 years of age was elaborated upon by Redmond's chief of police, Athel Dudley, who spoke after Wells. Dudley called for the consideration of a detention home in the county for children whose age forbids their being held in any place of punishment where adult law-violators are also detained.
