

Stocks Decline On Eastern Mart

New York, June 21 (UP)—Stocks declined on a profit-taking movement today as Wall Street adopted a cautious policy pending further disclosures concerning the reported naval battle in the Pacific.

As prices eased late in the session trading continued to dwindle from the active pace of the previous 10 sessions.

At the opening of dealings, liquor shares developed firmness reflecting an overnight announcement that the WFB would permit production for the month of August of beverage alcohol. Profit-taking wiped out the gains temporarily but the advance was resumed before the close.

Late gains in the liquors ranged to more than a point in American Distilling. Distillers Corp., Seagram's was up a point. Park & Tilford Inc., selling for cash, dropped 8 1/2 points to a new low for the year on action by the Pennsylvania state liquor authority to ban in that state the recently announced whiskey distribution by the company.
