Tax Sales Bring Break to Market

New York, Dec. 27 dP-Longpostponed tax selling broke out on the stock market today when Washington reports gave a clue to a bleak future for tax reduc

Prices broke 1 to more than 3 points when selling was at its height at mid-session and for a time the tickers were unable to keep pace with the market.

Traders who had anticipated do-ing their selling to establish profits for the income tax account next year to profit by a reduced tax dumped part of their holdings on a market unwilling to absorb

stock except at reduced prices.

However, the recession finally attracted new buyers and prices came back substantially from the lows in many instances.


