It will be the two-month task of these census bureau interviewers to make a comprehensive tabulation of U. S. farms, farm-ers, farm dollars, livestock, crops and other miscellaneous agricultural data.

First question census takers will determine is, "what constitutes a farm?"

Perhaps the most detailed questions will cover the livestock population. The enumerator will determine the number of chickens and turkeys raised, income from poultry, number of cows and helfers milked, how many gallons of milk produced and quantity of butter sold.
