Bets Influence Score of Game

New York, Jan. 11 (AP)—Coach Nat Holman of the City college basketball team revealed today that he had deliberately instructed one of his players, Bill Levine, to decline a free throw in order to prevent bookmakers from making a clean sweep on bets in the C.C.N.Y.-Syracuse game at Madison Square Garden last night.

City college was a six to eight point favorite, which meant that bookmakers had given Syracuse bettors six points, but had taken eight points on bets by City college supporters. At the time of the foul on Levine, late in the game, City led by six points. Had Levine been permitted to shoot and make the free throw, the game probably would have ended with City college seven points ahead, giving the bookmakers winning bets on both sides.

"When it gets to the point where bookmakers instead of the coaches try to run the game, college basketball will be in bad shape," Holman said. "This time I just happened to know the betting odds and I didn't want to give them any satisfaction."

Oregon Gloves Tourney Delayed

Portland, Ore., Jan. 11 (AP)—A three-day golden gloves boxing tournament, originally scheduled by the State Amateur Athletic union for Jan. 17-19, has been postponed until March 7-9, Herman Devault, of the Ramblers club, who has been appointed director of the show, said today.

Postponement was ordered because of conflict with the American Legion's amateur boxing tourney on the same date. Proceeds of the state tourney will be turned over to the march of dimes fund, Devault said.

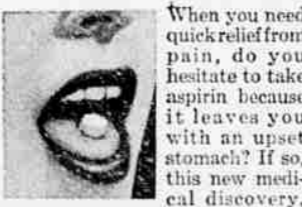
