ent misunderstanding on the part of many Bend men, J. D. Donovan, chairman of the Deschutes county selective service board, today explained that only those in non-essential jobs will be reclas sified. This applies not only to those in the 4-F classification, but all other men in jobs not neces-

ary to the war effort. "There have been numerous calls from men even in the Bend mills inquiring about their sta-tus," Donovan stated. "It must be understood that the lumber industry is considered essential to the prosecution of the war, and that men employed in it will not be disturbed unless they are found to have a record of ab-senteelsm. Their status will re-main unchanged unless the selec-tive service laws are changed tive service laws are changed. "Certainly, the men who are not in essential work know this fact, and these men are the ones we will call in and reclassify,"

Donovan added.


