

Siberia-Born Wac Knows Full Well Ravages of War

Ft. Des Moines, Ia. (AP)—Pvt. Ekaterina Miller, Russian-born member of the Women's Army Corps at Ft. Des Moines, has had more misadventure in her life than a movie serial actress.
Pvt. Miller was born at the turn of the century in Biagovesensk, on the Manchurian-Siberian border, where her father owned gold mines. Graduating at 16 from a high school in Moscow, she married an officer in the white army. He was killed in action in World War I, leaving her a widow with a young daughter.
There was nothing to do, she says, except cross Russia again to her parents' home. At first the revolution had little effect on the remote outpost of Russia, but finally agitators at the mines roused trouble, and burned their house. Her parents escaped to Mongolia with her little girl, and she started off on a 10-month journey on foot to Manchuria. Later, Pvt. Miller says, she heard that her parents and her daughter were killed.
Old Friend Turns Up
She arrived at last in China, after months of cold and hunger and encounters with units of revolutionaries. She was lucky, she explained, in China, renegade, dirty, and hungry, she found in a Manchurian city an old friend of her father's, who took her in, and gave her a job.
Pvt. Miller eventually moved on to Shanghai where she lived for nine years as a governess in the household of a Chinese millionaire who had eight wives and five sons. Her charges dressed in gorgeous silk robes and had princely manners, she said.
At a party given by her Russian friends in Shanghai, she met Lt. (j.g.) Herman Miller, an American naval officer. Although neither could speak the other's language, an "understanding" was reached. He proposed through an interpreter and in the same fa-

shion she accepted.
Daughter in Orphanage
She told him first about her daughter, and he promised to ask the Red Cross to help find the girl if she were still alive. They were married and moved to Manila when he was transferred.
Following their marriage, they lived in the Philippines and in Honolulu before coming to the United States. And then, after years of fruitless search, a friend in Moscow located the missing daughter in a Soviet orphanage.
The girl was brought to this country after her step-father legally adopted her and her mother became a citizen of the United States. Young Nina travelled

across Europe and the Atlantic ocean with a sign around her neck, telling her name and destination since she could speak only Russian.
She is now married to a police officer in Honolulu.
Pvt. Miller's home is in San Francisco, Cal.
A church-owned forest of 75 acres in New England, purchased in 1760, has netted the church \$4.45 per acre per year for the past 100 years.
