

Special Issues Make Big Gains

By Elmer C. Walter (United Press Financial Editor) New York, March 2 (UP)—Stocks moved irregularly on moderately active trading today.

Opening firm and fairly active, the list went into a decline in the morning dealings but steadied later when traders turned their attention to special issues.

Several specials had wide gains—as much as 5 1/2 points in Safeway stores whose directors voted to split the stock three for one.

There were a few wide losses, notably in A. O. Smith which dropped 9 points at its low.

Early recessions were ascribed to technical items, including the usual week-end evening up operations.

Railroad shares, widest losses on the decline, were the first to come back. Norfolk & Western jumped more than 2 points.

Chicago Great Western issues made new highs. So did Chesapeake & Ohio although that issue later lost a fractional gain.

It was heavily traded as were Baltimore & Ohio, New York Central, Lehigh Valley and Delaware, Lackawanna & Western.

2 Milk Control Bills Approved

Salem, Ore., March 2 (UP)—The entire milk control program as coordinated and presented by the food and dairy industries committee was through the house with no dissent today.

House bills 234 and 369, which require the pasteurization of all milk from a certified disease-free herd, and a system of inspections for cattle diseases, passed, both unanimously.

Members of the food and dairy committee explained that extensive hearings had been held on the measures, which are companion bills with two milk grading and testing bills passed earlier this week.
