

Market Extends Tuesday Gains

By Elmer C. Walzer (United Press Financial Editor) New York, March 28 (UP) — Peace rumors evaporated in the financial district today and the stock market extended yesterday's gains by fractions to more than a point.

As the street lost interest in the premature peace reports which circulated freely yesterday trading volume fell off substantially. Hudson Motor led in turnover and made a new high on a gain of more than a point in response to a favorable earnings report. International Telephone resumed its activity and rose a point. Graham-Nage and Packard were active and firm.

Leading motors rose major fractions. Steels at their highs showed gains ranging to a point in Bethlehem, but later lost part of the rise. Rails held fractions to a point higher. Some higher priced issues, including Nickel Plate preferred and Pere Marquette preferred, were up 2 or 3 points.

Airlines were prominent on the upside under leadership of Eastern which at its high of 55-1/4 was up 4 points. American rose more than 2 and the others a point or better.
