

Russ Act on Nips Speeds Up Market

By Elmer C. Walzer (United Press Financial Editor) New York, April 5 (UP)—Stocks receded and activity increased today when Russia denounced its neutrality pact with Japan.

First reaction of the list to the Russian action was apathy, but gradually interpretations of the action which ranged to early Russian war against Japan brought increased selling. Traders said such move would hasten the end of the war against Japan and bring all-out reconversion that much nearer.

Early in the day trading had been at a rate of less than a half million shares—smallest since last September—and prices had moved in a very narrow area. Around closing time, losses running to more than 2 points were spread over a broad section of the market with all groups affected.
