Stocks Develop Firm Undertone

New York, April 6 (UP)—Stocks developed a firm tone in the late trading today after early irregularity. Volume lightened compared with yesterday's total.

All major groups registered a technical recovery following the recent setback. Gains ranging to more than a point were spread over a broad area. The individual volume generally was small and with no outstanding feature in activity.

Railroad issues made the best group showing. Gains of a point or more were noted in Atlantic Coast Line, Southern Pacific, and Nickel Plate preferred. Rail equipments steadied after early recessions.

Steels moved higher under the leadership of U. S. Steel. Coppers gained a trifle to a point, the latter in Kennecott. Oils strengthened with Superior Oil of California up more than three points. Du Pont shares gained fractionally.

PINE ORDERS DROP

Portland Ore., April 6 (UP)—Following is the report for the week ending March 31 of comparative figures on lumber orders, shipments and production, based on information from 103 identical mills, as furnished by the Western Pine association here Friday:

Orders for western pine lumber for the week ending March 31 totaled 75,491,000 feet as compared with 83,953,000 feet for the previous week and 60,912,000 feet for the corresponding week last year. Similar comparisons of shipment are 59,172,000 feet, 55,008,000 feet and 73,722,000 feet and of production are 52,045,000 feet, 52,416,000 feet and 60,079,000 feet.
