San Francisco, April 24 (U.P.)—The United Nations conference on international organization was jeopardized today before it began as the American British-Russian dispute over Polish participation was transferred here for adjustment.

The first plenary conference session is scheduled for 4:30 p. m., PWT tomorrow. With scarcely more than 24 hours to go, the "Big Three" found themselves in the embarrassing position of being unable to settle a misunderstanding which they thought they had cleared up last winter in the Crimea.


