

# Capt. Dave Silven Wins Bronze Star

With the 32nd Infantry Division in Pangasinan Province, Luzon, P. I., May 3—Capt. David C. Silven, whose wife, the former Kathleen Duffy, lives at Bend, Ore., has been awarded the bronze star medal for meritorious achievement in connection with military action against the enemy on Leyte, in the Philippines. The citation reads:

"As commanding officer of a headquarters company, Silven coordinated the activities of his platoon, much of the time under enemy fire. His pioneer and ammunition platoon worked tirelessly in keeping a constant flow of supplies to the front line troops. His anti-tank platoon did remarkable work, and was credited with knocking out two Jap 47MM field pieces. At all times his communication platoon provided a never failing system of communications within the battalion. The efficient manner in which his entire company performed its duties reflects great credit upon Capt. Silven's leadership and his ability to handle men. In addition to his responsibility as a tactical commander, he carried out the administrative functions as battalion S-1 in a superior manner."

Capt. Silven, formerly an attorney in Baker, Ore., has done extensive work as defense council, trial judge advocate and law member of both general and special courts martials.

Graduating from the University of Oregon in 1938 with an ROTC commission, he entered the service in June, 1942. Overseas since
