Trading Gains, Stocks Advance

New York, May 16 (UP)—Trading increased in volume and stocks advanced steadily through today's session.

Late in the session gains ranging to more than 2 points spread through the list. About the only exceptions were the aircrafts, where losses ranged to more than a point in Douglas. This group still felt the influence of a reduced dividend by United Aircraft.

A higher dividend for Johns-Manville sent that stock soaring nearly 4 points to its 1945 high. A dividend increase also sent Allied stores to a new high. American Telephone equalled its high in a declaration of the regular quarterly dividend of \$2.25 a share maintained steadily since 1922.

Southern Pacific and Union Pacific with gains of more than a point each featured the rails where Northern Pacific was active. Utilities had a small gain on balance. Store shares rose with Allied. Marshall Field and J. C. Penney made new highs, the latter up 2 points. Motors, steels, oils, and farm implements firmed.

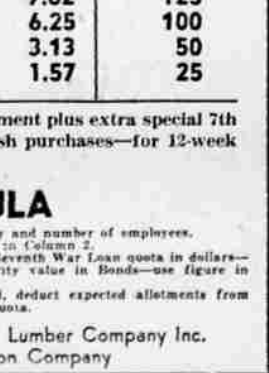
