

Decline of Stocks On Market Noted

By T. W. Kienlen (United Press Staff Correspondent) New York, May 23 (UP)—Stocks declined to more than a point in the main list today in slightly more active trading. Wall Street analysts attributed the sell-off largely to technical reasons, pointing out that a reaction has been overdue after the recent extended period of rising prices. That it came today, these quarters indicated, was principally because of yesterday's action by Rep. Gearhart, R., Cal., in introducing a bill to permit a 30 percent wage increase and some uncertainty created by the government crisis in England. Business and industrial news generally was favorable. Bigger dividends were voted by directors of United Merchants and Manufacturers and Zonite products and the board of the Chesapeake and Ohio voted a special distribution of shares of Pittston company held by the road to holders of C and O common. Edison Electric Institute reported a sharp rebound in electricity production last week, the first full week since dimout and curfew restrictions had been lifted.
