Failure of a huge transformer at the generating plant of the Pacific Power & Light company in Bend shortly after midnight, cast the city in total darkness for 13 minutes, stopped electric clocks and halted all power-driven equipment.

William A. Lackaff, manager of the power company, said that workmen were attempting today to determine what caused the 1,000 kilowatt transformer to go out of order.

In a battery of three transformers the one which failed was the one serving Bend. Lackaff said that it required electricians 13 minutes to restore service after making connections with a spare transformer.

Permits Required For Slash Burning
Despite the heavy rainfall, persons planning to burn slash or brush in the Deschutes national forest or in the farming communities of the district, must have a permit, Ralph W. Crawford, supervisor of the forest, stated today.

Persons desiring to burn in the fire protective areas, may obtain their permits from any ranger or from state fire wardens, Crawford explained. Others in the farming districts may obtain their permission to burn from the county judge.
