

### New Provisions In Vet Pensions To Add \$37,000,000

Washington (UP)—Including Mrs. Morgan's \$20 a month, the U. S. pension bill for fiscal 1944 was \$158,000,000.

Mrs. Esther Hill Morgan of Independence, Ore., still receives \$240 a year because her father fought with the New York militia in the war of 1812. Mrs. Morgan's money is all the veterans administration expends today on that war.

The Civil War still costs nearly \$14,000,000 in pensions, however, and veterans and veterans' dependents for the Indian wars draw \$2,300,000. World War I payments were four times as large as those for World War II—\$254,000,000 for the first; \$50,000,000 for the second. Pensions now go to 896,000 veterans and 364,000 dependents.

**New Regulations Made**  
The 1945 pension bill will be bigger by at least \$37,000,000 because congress has decided to take care of widows and minor children of World War I veterans whose deaths were not caused by service disabilities.

The new regulations make the childless widow whose income is less than \$1,000 and the widow with children whose income is less than \$2,500 eligible for benefits simply if her dead husband served at least 90 days in the last war and was honorably discharged.

This gives the widows of World War I veterans one advantage over their sisters of World War II. If their husbands died as a re-

result of service, both receive pensions until they die or remarry. Likewise, both are pensioned if their husbands had service-connected disabilities, yet died of something else.

**World War I Vets Only**  
But if two honorably discharged veterans—one of each war—and neither one disabled in service, should die in an automobile accident, only the widow and children of the World War One veteran would be pensioned.

Payments will begin in the newest class as each dependent establishes her claim at the nearest

veterans administration office. She can do this by mail.

Benefits provided are: \$35 monthly for a widow; \$45 for a widow and one child; and \$5 additional for each child. A veteran's orphan is eligible for \$18 monthly; two orphans for \$27; three, \$36. Total compensation to one family cannot be more than \$64 a month.

The veterans administration estimates that payments will be made to 81,500 dependents under the new law next year.

The benefits, for both wars, for dependents of veterans whose death resulted from service, are:

A childless widow, \$30 a month; widow and one child, \$65; \$13 for each additional child; one orphan \$25; two orphans, \$38; and \$10 for each additional orphan;

one dependent parent, \$45 and two dependent parents, \$50. The total to any family cannot exceed \$100 a month.
