Ex-Yale Star In Island Battle

Okinawa, — (AP)—Marine 1st Lieut. Quentin Meyer, former Yale football star, was killed in action in a heroic attempt to aid a wounded member of his squad.

Meyer, as popular a leader of men here as he was on Yale's gridiron, met death at noon on the day, May 11, he was to be relieved after 11 days of spotting targets for naval gunfire.
