Red Cross Drive Shows Big Spurt

The Deschutes county 1946 American Red Cross fund today was only slightly more than \$3,000 behind the \$8,500 quota, solicitors reported, indicating that donations since the start of the week have made a spurt, according to Roland Reinhart, chairman of the special committee of the Junior Chamber of commerce sponsoring the drive. He reported that to date a total of \$5,138.85 has been received.

Reinhart attributed the slow campaign to the fact that this year there is no house-to-house solicitation. Because of this he urged would-be donors to take their contributions to either the Red Cross offices in the Bank of Bend building, to the chamber of commerce or to Symons Bros. jewelry store.

Quotas Listed Red Cross headquarters listed the different quotas and the amounts turned in as follows: Bend business district, \$3,500; received \$3,074.20; Redmond, \$1,500; received \$675; Sisters, quota, \$500, turned in \$35; Lapine, \$100, received \$37.15; The Shevlin-Hixon Company, \$1,300, received \$737.50; Brooks-Scanlon Lumber Company Inc., \$1,600, received \$600 and the rural districts with a quota of \$400 has made no reports.
