

Stocks Advance Up To 5 Points

By Elmer C. Walter (United Press Financial Writer) New York, Nov. 1 (AP)—Stocks advanced 1 to 5 points today with the general average at a new high since mid-October. Volume receded moderately from yesterday's pace.

Most stocks held gains from the opening to the close. A few including Bethlehem Steel and American Telephone, had a period of weakness but rallied later. A new buying spurt just before closing time left the list at the day's best levels.

Railroad and utility stocks were at their best levels since September 17 in the averages while the industrials were back to Oct. 21 prices. Cotton futures had a session of ups and downs but managed to hold gains ranging to \$3 a bale. Extreme gains had run to \$10. Wheat gained about a cent to two cents a bushel. Other factors favorable to the market included a new post-war high in automobile production, earnings gains by Standard Oil of California and Hiram Walker, extra dividends by Standard Oil (N. J.) and Ohio Oil; and retail trade sales, 21 to 25 per cent above the corresponding week of last year.

They ask that the liner be moved off Greenwich as a floating hotel. Denmark wished to charter the ship and moor her off Copenhagen as extra hotel accommodation but the board of trade said "we thought of it first."
