Netted Gem Shipments Set Record

Redmond, Ore., Nov. 7 (AP)—All records for any one month were broken in October when 503 carloads of netted gem potatoes moved to outside markets from this area, Ben Davidson, inspector for the state department of agriculture, reported today.

Shipments at Redmond reached 378 cars and at Prineville 125, each car filled with 360 100-pound bags.

He said that never had quality been higher. The total crop of Deschutes, Crook and Jefferson counties for this year reached 3000 acres, Davidson said, and he estimated that 300 acres remain in the fields, with growers busy with harvests.

Sisters Elects 3 Councilmen Sisters, Nov. 7 (Special)—Sisters voters went to the polls on Tuesday and elected three members to its five-man council. George Wakefield, with a count of 122, was returned to his council seat; while Clyde W. Bush with 94 votes, and Richard Day with 87, became new additions to the municipal body.

Defeated were Richard Walters, 76 votes, and Cliff Ullman, 61. In the state elections, the only sharply decisive voting was shown in the gubernatorial race with Earl Snell chosen over his opponent by a 3 to 1 majority; and in the selection of secretary of state, with Robert S. Farrell outdistancing Epps by approximately the same majority.

The bill to create state old-age pensions was defeated here by a good margin, which came as a surprise in this strong Townsend club area.
