UNUSUAL CLOUDS
A friend called our attention to some unusual clouds in the western sky this past week-end. He said they looked like a mountain mirage.

Factors entering into the unique cloud formations observed in this part of the state, so we learned, are varied. The dominant factor is the clash of Great Basin and coastal weather, with the Cascades as the breastworks separating the conflicting air currents.

The warmer, moist airs from the ocean go aloft as they sweep inland from the Pacific, and thousands of feet over the Cascades the first sign of an approaching storm are marked by delicate cirrus clouds.

Delicate rainbow colors characterize the high ice clouds of winter, the weather observer said, but summer yields the most gaudy colors, as thunderheads break up in the sunset skies. These thunderheads, so it appears, are literally "cloud factories."

Washington, D. C. — Something new was added to the Washington labor picture with the issuance of an 11-point labor reform program by the department of commerce.

Heretofore in government administrative circles, department of labor has been labor and department of commerce has been management. Each minded its own business—before Henry Wallace became secretary of commerce.

Though given in general terms, the commerce statement goes far beyond the president's labor reform recommendations to congress. It is also just as broad as anything proposed by the republicans in congress. Briefly, it includes such principles as these: The public interest must be paramount in any labor-management relations.

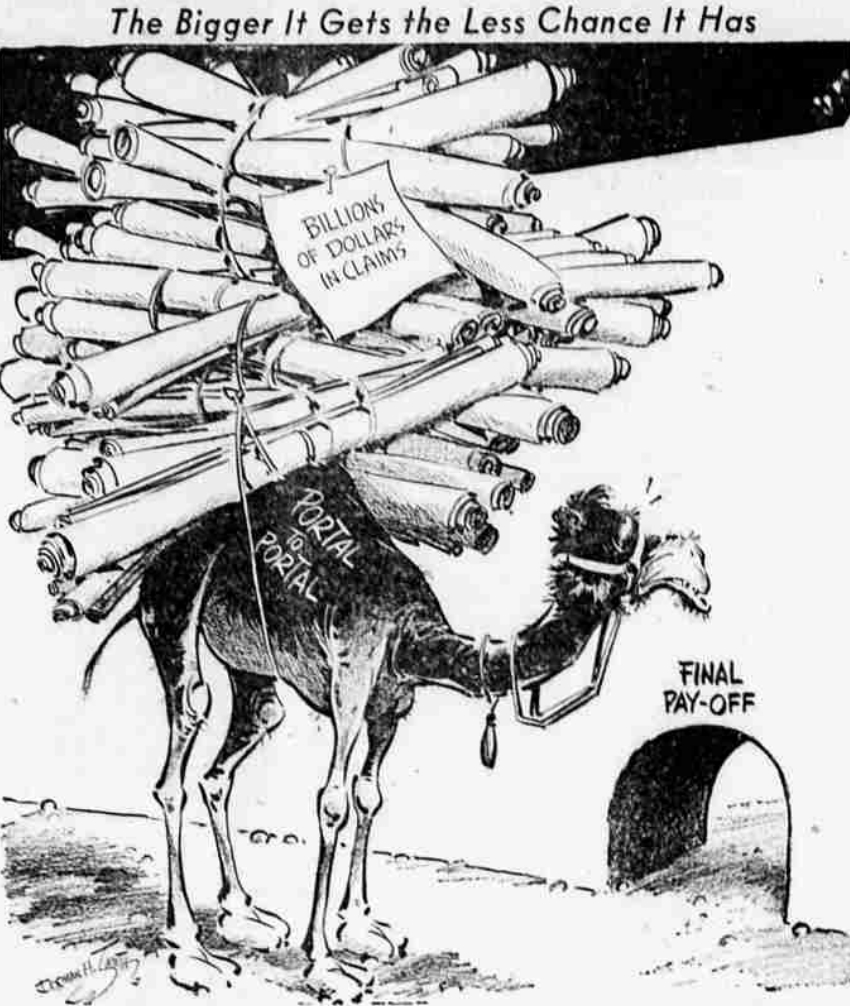
This program was drawn up by the department of commerce small business advisory committee. That's an organization of 18 private businessmen. Its function is to advise the department on how it can aid small business.

Secretary Harriman is known to be deeply interested in labor relations. He does not believe that the department of commerce has any business trying to administer the labor laws or administration labor policy.

Secretary Harriman has set up as an adjunct of his own headquarters an office of program planning. It is headed by Phil Hauser, who was one of Henry Wallace's bright young men in the department of agriculture.

'Voice Of America' Programs Will Be Beamed To Russians

Washington, Jan. 21 (AP)—The state department's plan to skip soviet censorship with daily Russian-language broadcasts is scheduled to begin about Feb. 15, it was learned yesterday.

The "Voice of America" programs will originate in New York. They will be relayed to Russian listeners during early evening hours from a powerful transmitter in Munich, Germany.

Program planning calls for an hour-long broadcast each night of American news items, cultural discussions and music. American officials, including retiring Secretary of State James F. Byrnes, long have been perturbed over the meager facts available to the Russian people.

The impetus for the Russian-language programs came from Byrnes last spring during the stormy sessions of the council of foreign ministers in Paris. He told intimates that the best way to knife the lack of Russian understanding would be through direct broadcasts to the people.

Initiation of the Russian programs was delayed until an adequate Russian-speaking force could be hired. Technical difficulties also held up the idea.

State department sources said that a tentative staff of five full-time and about 10 part-time Russian-speaking persons has been recruited and is working on the broadcasts.

REA Finances May Be Slashed

Washington, Jan. 21 (AP)—A move got under way in congress Monday to curtail or halt government loans to rural electric cooperatives.

It was touched off by circular letters from a co-op official saying the republican-controlled congress might "sabotage" the rural electrification program.

Chairman Clare E. Hoffman, R., Mich., of the house executive expenditures committee, denounced the letters as "propaganda" and demanded to know if they were paid for with government funds.

"If the co-ops are using government money for this propaganda, it is illegal," Hoffman said, "and if they've got enough of their own money to use for this purpose, they don't need any from the government."

Hendryx Named To State Board

Salem, Ore., Jan. 21 (AP)—Gov. Earl Snell today announced appointment of H. E. Hendryx, Baker, as a member of the State Board of Geology and Mineral Industries, succeeding S. H. Williston, who resigned.

Hendryx, a mining engineer and consultant, formerly was publisher of the Baker Herald and edited a mining journal prior to World War II.

Williston resigned because of business reasons, Snell said.

Stalin Admits Deterioration Of Friendship

New York, Jan. 21 (AP)—Premier Josef Stalin believes that relations between the United States and Russian governments have deteriorated, but that relations between the people of the two nations are better and "the danger of a new war is not real," Elliott Roosevelt said in a copyrighted story in Look Magazine.

Roosevelt, in his account of an interview which took place December 21 in Stalin's office in the Kremlin in Moscow, said that the soviet premier appeared to be in good health, although thinner than when Roosevelt had seen him three years previously.

Stalin's comments on relations between the two powers were made when Roosevelt asked: "Stalin Replies. 'To what do you ascribe the lessening in friendly relations and understanding between our two countries since the death of Franklin Roosevelt?'"

Stalin answered: "I feel that if this question relates to relations and understanding between the American and Russian peoples, no deterioration has taken place, but on the contrary relations have improved. 'As to relations between the two governments, there have been misunderstandings. Certain deterioration has taken place and then great noise was raised that their relations would even deteriorate still further. But I see nothing frightful about this in the sense of a violation of peace or a military conflict.'
