

### Central Oregon Sports Review

A week from tonight, Central Oregon's four top hoop squads will square off in the big Redmond basketball floor to decide this region's entry into the state tournament which will be held at McArthur court in Eugene on March 11, 12, 13, 14 and 15. The Redmond floor will be big enough to take care of the teams playing but the rather scant seating capacity is expected to be taxed to the limit. No announcement has been made by the tournament management as to the manner in which the crowd will be handled. However, it should not be forgotten that the tournament is being played to select the best basketball team from this section and that reasonable clearance should be provided around the playing floor so that the crowd does not interfere with the play of the teams. Too many times the administrators become too concerned with the gate receipts in the interscholastic playoffs to the detriment of the boys taking part. This is the crux of the behind the scenes battle that has been carried on in this state for several years between the board of control of Oregon High School Activities association and the State Coaches association. This has been particularly bitter in the football playoffs where most up state coaches resent the setting of the state championship football playoffs in the swampy Multnomah stadium. The board of control holds to this arrangement because of the greater "take" at the gate.

With the rapid improvement of the Prineville team it is a good thing that the Bears were able to topple the Panthers the last time they met on the local court, thus insuring themselves against the possibility of this happening. The Cowboys have set their sights on the finals of the tourney and are definitely out to upset the Panthers in the opening night of play.

An overflow crowd similar to that which attended the jamboree early in December would be a definite hindrance to the play of the teams.
