Hollywood, Feb. 22 (U.P.)—If you, like George Washington, cannot tell a lie, you're a likely candidate for a mental hospital, a psychologist said today. Alice Laverne said that maybe back in the 18th century the father of his country could go 67 years without telling a lie. But men and women in the 20th century could not keep mentally and physically healthy without white lies or part truths to smooth their paths. "People who make a fetish of telling the truth at all times, regardless of the pain which it may cause others or themselves, are candidates for insane asylums," she said. "Nobody can tell the truth all the time without enmeshing himself and others in a maze of conflicts and tensions that eventually lead to telling lies. That goes for George Washington too."

Farrell, Jr., today defended his proposal to transfer \$1,000,000 of highway funds from the highway commission to the state police to increase efficiency in policing highways. Democracy Topic Of Broadcasts

The first of six patriotic broadcasts, "Safe-guards for America," presented by the Supreme Council of the Knights of Columbus and sponsored locally by the Father Luke Sheehan council will be heard at 4:30 Sunday over station KBND. The central theme of the series of dramatic sketches is the contrast between conditions of life under American democracy and the situation of labor, religion and personal liberty in the U. S. S. R. and in Soviet-controlled lands, council members said. The first sketch is a re-enactment of the arrival of Lenin in Moscow during the first World War, the early days of the revolution, the birth of the dreaded Cheka and its effects upon the lives of Russia's patient millions.
