THEORIES OF NEGOTIATION

With the telephone strike already two weeks old and the public apparently content to remain on the sidelines for whatever time may be needed to end the contest, it can be understood why Joseph A. Beirne, president of the National Federation of Telephone Workers, who started it all, is becoming increasingly anxious for a settlement.

Negotiation is a far better method. Incidentally, it is still available, although Mr. Beirne seeks to create the impression that the government must step in to force the companies to accept it as a method.

In labor negotiations one of two theories may be applied. One considers that agreements should be reached on an industry-wide basis, the other that local organizations should have the responsibility for the composing of differences between employers and employees.

In the calling of the telephone strike and in the fact that, since that time, there has been no progress toward resumption of negotiations, we see demonstrated the incompatibility of these two theories.

It is our opinion that better, more just results for all concerned would follow the acceptance of this plan. It is also easy to see that it would not be to the personal interest of Mr. Beirne. His importance would suffer.

This, as we see it, is the prime issue today in the settlement of the telephone strike. It is important that it should be recognized. It will be big news when the walkout is over, but it will not be especially good news if the settlement involves the confirmation of another dictatorship.

Seal Gnaws Big Douglas Fir And Lumbermen Are Alarmed

Seattle, April 21 (AP) — Discovery of a seal gnawing the base of a giant Douglas fir in Vancouver, B. C., had northwest lumbermen in a state of alarm today.

The errant seal, according to the Vancouver Sun, was surprised in the act by Trapper Les Johnson.

Johnson told the Sun he found the new timber menace five miles from water deep in virgin timber stands.

"Never seen nothin' like it," he said. "Can't figure it—unless it's because seal bounties have been upped."

Johnson referred to a recent directive from Washington state fish and wildlife service which said, effective May 1, seal bounties would be jumped from \$3 to \$8.

"I came on him quiet. But he heard me and skeaddled. He moved awful fast," said Johnson. Judging by the large bite taken from the tree the trapper thought the truant mammal must have been starved.

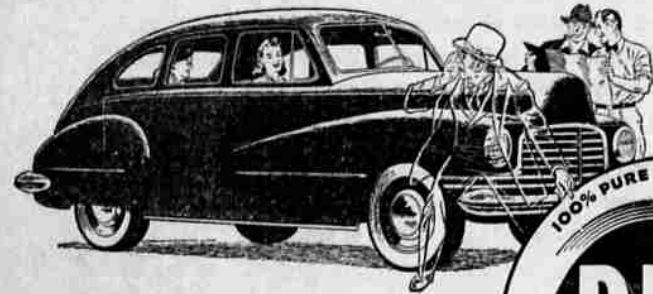
