Students Too Bright Or Tests Too Easy

Syracuse, N. Y. (AP)—Too many students are getting "A's" at the Syracuse University graduate school.

The board of graduate studies reached that conclusion after surveying 2,279 grades given out last semester.

Among graduate students alone, the board found almost 42 per cent of the grades were A's, 51 per cent B's, about 6 per cent C's, and only 5 per cent D's and F's.

The board has called on a committee to establish a uniform grading system for all departments of the university.

Church Row Recalled After 100 Years

Meriden, Conn. (AP)—When the Baptists started to build their church next door to one already owned by the Congregational Society in 1847, the latter group sought to prevent it by an injunction.

They agreed the Baptists themselves were not objectionable but that their pastor, the Rev. Mr. Miller, had a "peculiarly sharp ringing voice" which it was feared might disturb the Congregational meetings. Nevertheless, the Baptist church was built.
