Washington, Oct. 21 (AP)—Next move in the Russian-inspired campaign against United States world-wide foreign policy is slated to come shortly in Montevideo, capital of Uruguay.

Invitations have been issued to some of the communist parties in the various countries of South America to send delegates to Montevideo for conference.
