

Trojans, Uclans Hog Spotlight; U. S. C. Favored

New York, Nov. 21 (UP)—Good old tradition and the steam it is supposed to generate in "neighborhood" football battles became the major factor today in the final big Saturday of the season in which Southern California's clash with UCLA was the game of the day.

The Los Angeles schools from different sides of the tracks will be battling with different motives in mind, Southern California with the idea of getting into the Rose bowl against Michigan, and UCLA with the thought of keeping the Trojans out of Pasadena on New Year's day.

U.S.C. Favored
The odds-makers gave Southern California, unbeaten and tied only by Rice early in the season, the benefit of the doubt, making the Trojans seven point favorites.

The co-leaders for national championship honors, Notre Dame and Michigan, were treated impartially by the odds-makers, with each a 34-point favorite to dispose of its opposition. Notre Dame winds up a long inter-sectional series with Tulane at South Bend, Ind., while Michigan with the Big Nine title and the Rose bowl ride already in the bag, closes out its regular campaign with Ohio State.

Southern Methodist, tops in the Southwest conference, was a 13-point favorite to breeze past last



place Baylor while Penn State's Nittany Lions were rated as 14 points better than Pitt's punchless Panthers.

Oregon Has Chance
Elsewhere most of the games were of less importance, although Oregon, playing Oregon State, still has a chance to tie for the Pacific coast conference championship by winning, and was a six-point favorite to do so.

If North Carolina tops the Blue Devils, it will knock them out of the Southern conference title.
