

## Officials Of Army Studying Meyer's Love Problems

Washington, Nov. 21 (AP)—Army authorities, it was learned today, are studying Maj. Gen. Bennett E. Meyer's testimony of an old "love affair" with the wife of his chief accuser to determine whether official action should be taken.

Though Meyer now is retired from active duty, authorities said the army still can assume jurisdiction in the case if circumstances warrant.

They said the army judge advocate general's office is examining Meyer's story to senate investigators about a five-year romance he said he carried on with his former secretary, Mrs. Mildred Lamar. Mrs. Lamar's husband, Bleriot, has testified that he was the figure-head "president" of a war contracting firm which the general owned and from which he secretly got more than \$130,000.

**Court Martial Refused**  
The army recently refused Meyer's request for a court martial. But it did not rule out the possibility of action after the senate was investigating subcommittee concludes its hearings, possibly today or tomorrow.

A spokesman for the judge advocate general's office said the army would consult with Attorney General Tom C. Clark before any action is taken. Clark already has announced that the justice department will seek an indictment against the general on charges of income tax evasion.

Meyer was to return to the witness stand today. He said he had enough testimony "to keep going for two hours more." After that it was likely the committee members would want to question him further.

**Witness Consulted**  
Gen. H. H. (Hap) Arnold, wartime air forces chief and Meyer's superior, also was listed as a probable witness. Meyer told investigators that Arnold knew of his stock holdings in aircraft concerns and did not object to them.

The testimony under scrutiny by the judge advocate general's office concerns Meyer's relations with Mrs. Lamar who worked for him in his office at Wright field, O. The general testified yesterday that she was his "girl friend" from 1936 to 1940 "with Mr. Lamar's knowledge, approval and acquiescence." Meyer was then married to Mary Jane Brownell, his second wife.

Salem, Ore., Nov. 21 (AP)—The state emergency board meeting for the first time since its reorganization Thursday elected Sen. Carl Engdahl, Pendleton as its new chairman and confirmed two appointments to its membership made by Gov. John H. Hall.

Engdahl succeeds the late senate president Marshall E. Cornett as chairman.

New members whose appointments were confirmed are State Rep. Earle Johnson, Corvallis, and Sen. Eugene E. Marsh, McMinnville. Marsh fills the seat left vacant by the death of Cornett and Johnson takes over the seat vacated by Governor Hall when he resigned to become governor.

The board was reorganized following the death of Cornett, and the late Gov. Earl Snell and Secretary of the Court might deem just in the premises.
