

### Higbe of Pirates Registers Win Over Braves, 5-3

New York, June 4 (AP)—The suggestion that the Pirates might have the best pitching depth in the National league would start plenty of arguments, but the records revealed today that they have more hurlers with plus records than any other club.

The Pirates have six hurlers who have won more games than they have lost. No other club in the majors except the mound-rich Athletics of the American league can match that mark. The Pirate "plus men" are Bob Chesnes (2-0), Rip Sewell (3-1), Elmer Riddle (5-2), Kirby Higbe (4-3), Fritz Ostermueller (2-1), and Mel Queen (1-0). Counting the 1-0 mark of Jim Walsh, who was farmed out, they have seven.

**Registers Fourth Win**

Yesterday, Higbe registered his fourth victory for the Pirates, 5 to 3 over the Braves at Pittsburgh.

Rookies put on the show as the Phils topped the Cubs, 4 to 3 at Chicago. With Curt Simmons pitching his third victory, kid team mates Richie Ashburn and Gran Hamner led the offensive drive with three hits each.

In a night game, the St. Louis Cards ended a six-game losing streak and climbed to within a half-game of first place by beating Brooklyn, 4 to 1, at St. Louis as Country Slaughter and Stan Musial paced the win with homers.

**Giants Lose Game**

The league-leading New York Giants dropped a night tilt to pitcher Ewell Blackwell of the Cincinnati Reds, 6 to 4.

Hal Newhouser, pitching with all of his old craft, topped the Yankees 6 to 2 at New York as his Detroit team mates put on a bunting spree that led to a four-run 11th inning rally.

Jack Kramer of the Red Sox beat his old team mates, the Browns, with a 3 to 2 eight-hitter at Boston.

Cleveland at Washington and Chicago at Philadelphia were rained out in the American.

**Two Titles Held By Louise Suggs**

St. Anne's-on-the-Sea, England, June 4 (AP)—Louise Suggs, a Pert southern belle with iron nerve and steel muscles, had a chance today to rack up a "grand slam" unprecedented in the history of women's golf.

The brand-new owner of the British women's amateur championship, earned by a one-hole victory yesterday during a wind-lashed rainstorm, the dark-haired, lovely was favored to become the first gal ever to win that and the United States women's crown in the same year.

She now holds both titles, but she earned the U.S. crown last year. And must defend it this year, Sept. 13-18, at the rugged Pebble Beach course, Del Monte, Calif. Mrs. Mildred (Babe Dicks) Zaharias also hold both crowns simultaneously—but not won in the same year.

Miss Suggs gained the British Diadem when she outlasted Jean Donald, Scottish champion, 1 up in one of the most grueling 36-hole final matches ever played in any tournament anywhere.

### Klamath Falls Climbs In League

Oroville moved into the Far West league lead again today on the back of the willing, but unable Pittsburgh Pirates. Klamath Falls leaped to the number two spot, only a few percentage points ahead of the Santa Rosa Pirates.

The Red Sox defeated Pittsburgh, 3 to 2, at the climax of a pitching duel between Walt Evans and Dave Stratton. Evans limited the diamonds to three hits and struck out six batters to earn the win.

Klamath Falls made it two straight over the Willows Cards, 8 to 7, on the 10-hit pitching of southpaw Bob Blengino, former St. Mary's college star.

Redding took the measure of Santa Rosa, 20 to 12, for the second time in a row with 14 hits and 17 walks providing the scoring punch.

Taking advantage of Larry Smith's erratic hurling, the Medford Dodgers routed the Marysville Braves, 8 to 1.

### Meat Prices Hold To Upward Trend

Meat prices have continued upward since the CIO packinghouse workers ended their strike May 24 but in most cases the increase has been slight, a nationwide survey in 10 cities showed today.

Experts in the various cities differed, however, as to the reason for the continued increase. Many had predicted that the strike's end would bring more abundant and cheaper meat to the nation's dinner tables.

The biggest increases were at St. Louis and Detroit. Prices in those two cities appeared to have risen almost 10 cents a pound on each cut.

Prices Quoted  
Several cities, such as Milwaukee, Pittsburgh and Chicago, reported no increases. Prices dropped on some cuts at Los Angeles and Atlanta. At Atlanta, round steak dropped from 99 to 97 cents and sirloin from 99 to 95. Round steak dropped from 75 cents to 69 cents a pound at Los Angeles.

A Minneapolis meat dealer said the rising market was "definitely continuing" but that he didn't expect prices there to rise 10 cents.

Spokesmen for the national association of retail meat dealers did not believe the price rise was general. Executive secretary George Dressler said, however, that such a general increase may come soon.

### Engine Overturns; Three Men Killed

Hillsboro, Ore., June 4 (AP)—A locomotive of the Oregon-American Timber Co. overturned about 18 miles southwest of Vernonia yesterday, killing three crew members.

The dead were Jeffrey McGregor, 53, Milwaukie, Ore., engineer; Jerry R. Manning, 57, address unknown, fireman; and Frank Willis, 74, Estacada, Ore., timekeeper.

Cause of the accident near Camp Olson in Clatsop county was not determined immediately.


