

Abolish Father's Day, Is Advice Of Psychologist

Chicago, June 18 (AP)—Father's day does more harm than good and should be abolished, an authority on family life said today. Psychologist Lester A. Kirkendall—a father himself—said that fathers should be treated with honor and respect every day of the year.

"It's easy to make a one-day spurge for dad and think that's all there is to it," he said. Kirkendall, director of the Association for Family Living, made his comment just two days before the annual Father's day, to be observed Sunday.

He said that one of the worst approaches for a father is to try to be "palsy" with his children. Fathers should not be encouraged too much when they get the urge to run the children's electric trains or join in their sandlot games.

Behave Like Child
"Many dads confuse being 'pals' with being 'companions' to their children," Kirkendall said. "A dad who is a pal behaves like he did when he was at the children's level. He has the same reactions that he did when he was the youngest's age."

And that, said the psychologist, isn't good. "Kids want someone who can sympathize with and understand them," he said. "But at the same time, they look for the maturity and experience that all parents should possess."

If dad acts too "kiddish" the youngsters are apt to resent him because he doesn't behave in what they consider an adult manner. "Don't think that kids don't have a sense of appropriateness," Kirkendall said. "Most of the time it's just a case of dad trying to prolong his own adolescence."

"He should take the responsibility of establishing a cooperative family unit. Then both he and the children will be better off emotionally, and the youngsters will be better parents themselves some day."

Should Face Problems
"Some dads make the mistake of trying to shield children from the family problems. It would help the youngsters face life a lot easier if, as they grow older, they were included in family discussions of finances and other intimate affairs."

That's why it's necessary for dad to think of himself as the head of the family 365 days a year instead of just on that one

day which has been set aside for him, Kirkendall said.

Bill Provides For Flood Relief

Washington, June 18 (AP)—The house Thursday received from the senate a bill authorizing the Reconstruction Finance Corp. to extend long-term home reconstruction loans to victims of the Pacific northwest floods.

The measure was approved by the senate last night on a unanimous vote. It would raise from \$25,000,000 to \$40,000,000 the amount of RFC funds which may be used for disaster relief loans. It would also increase the amortization time of such loans from a maximum of 10 years to 25.

Sen. Harry P. Cain, R., Wash., told the senate the bill would permit rebuilding, possibly on a new site of the war-built city of Vaport, Ore., which was entirely wiped out by the flood. Cain sponsored the measure with Sens. Wayne Morse, R., Ore., Warren Magnuson, D., Wash., and Guy Cordon, R., Ore.

Geologists Study John Day Region

Joining an Oregon State college party already in the field, three representatives of the University of California department of paleontology moved into the John Day country today to continue the study of that region's geology, ancient animals and million-year-old forests. In the University of California party that stopped in Bend last night were Ted Downs and Morton Green, who are doing post-graduate work at the University of California, and Les Marcus, an undergraduate.

The young California scientists are to work with an Oregon State college field party headed by Dr. W. D. Wilkinson. In Dr. Wilkinson's group are 28 students, all geology majors from several western universities. Base camp has been set up in the vicinity of the Mascall ranch, a short distance south of Picture gorge. This is the second consecutive year that Dr. Wilkinson has headed geology summer camps in the John Day area.

The California students were sent into the John Day field by Dr. R. A. Stirton, nationally known paleontologist and member of the University of California staff. They will work in both the John Day and the Mascall deposits. These fossil-bearing formations are separated by the Columbia basalts.
