

Dodger Hurler Pitches Fourth Straight Victory

New York, July 21 (AP)—The faith that kept Pitcher Rex Barney in the majors even when he started in 24 straight games in three seasons without completing one, was paying off at last today for the Brooklyn Dodgers.

For Barney, the big Cornhusker from Nebraska who had blinding speed but not even remote control, finally has conquered his wildness and in an amazing reversal of form has pitched four straight complete games—all of them victories.

Yesterday, when he hurled his first major league shutout, a 5 to 0 victory over the Cubs at Chicago, the handsome right hander who used to coach wayward kids at Father Flanagan's Boys Town in Nebraska, was master all the way.

Braves Lose
The pace-setting Braves dropped their second straight game, 6 to 5, as the Reds outslugged them in a battle of home runs at Cincinnati.

The Pittsburgh Pirates, behind seven-hit pitching by Bob Cheneau, lambasted the Philadelphia Phils, 11 to 2, in a Pittsburgh night game.

The Red Sox moved to within a game of the faltering third-place Yankees in the American league, winning their fourth straight from the Browns, 8 to 3, at Boston.

The Tigers topped the Yankees, 2 to 1, at New York when George Kell doubled and Hoot Evers singled him home in the ninth to give Virgil (Fire) Trucks his eighth victory.

Indians Beaten
The Washington Senators got steady pitching from Ray Scarborough and beat the Cleveland Indians, 2 to 1, in the finale of a four-game series at Washington after losing the first three games. Don Black gave up both Senator runs.

Arino (Chuck) Pieretti pitched the Chicago White Sox to a 5 to 2 win over the Athletics at Philadelphia, giving only six hits.

New York at St. Louis in the National was rained out.

Washington, July 21 (AP)—Lou Boudreau, manager of the Cleveland Indians, said today that negro pitcher Satchel Paige has been forbidden by the American league to throw his favorite "hesitation" pitch.

The Washington Senators' sawawaked to league president Will Harridge after facing Paige's tricky delivery in a night game on Monday. Boudreau said he was

notified by telephone yesterday that Harridge declared the pitch illegal.

The delivery uses a "hitch," or momentary pause, which throws batters off their timing. The Senators complained that it constituted a balk with men on base.

Boost Announced In Steel Prices

Pittsburgh, July 21 (AP)—United States Steel boosted its prices to an all-time high today by increasing the cost of all finished steel products an average of \$9.34 a ton.

U. S. Steel sets the price pattern for the entire industry, and other large producers were expected to make corresponding raises. Thus the price boost eventually will be reflected in all finished products such as automobiles, refrigerators and electrical equipment.

The raise was to compensate for a nine per cent wage increase granted its workers last Friday, corporation president Benjamin F. Fairless said.

Driver to Appear On Two Charges

Dennis Beaulieu, of 924 Harrison, was released from the city jail last night long enough to appear in municipal court. He pleaded guilty to a charge of drunkenness Tuesday morning on Bond street, and time was set for two trials on charges to which he pleaded not guilty. He was fined \$25 and given a 10-day sentence on the drunk charge.

Russians Claim Invention of Plane

Washington, July 21 (AP)—Russia today claimed it built the first airplane in 1882. That was more than 30 years before the American Wright brothers made their famous flight at Kitty Hawk, N. C.

This "first" was chalked up by Radio Moscow beside other suddenly discovered historical achievements in science and engineering being claimed almost

daily by the Russians. Here are some excerpts from a broadcast to the Russian people which was overheard here by government monitors:
"Our country is the birthplace of aviation. The first airplane in the world was built in Russia in 1882 by Designer Mozhaisky. Only 20 years later did the Americans build their own first airplane.
"The famous Russian scientists Lomonosov, Mendeleev, Shukov, and others are the founders of present-day aviation theory. The USSR is also the birthplace of multi-engine planes, the first of which was designed in Russia in 1914. A year later, Russian designers had built a multi-engine bomber, the first in the world."
