Redmond, April 21—"All-American" is the honor rating given the Redmond union high school student newspaper for the first semester by the National Scholastic Press association. Only 16 of the high school papers in the United States submitted in the same group as Panther Scratches, Redmond high's paper, received the All-American rating, highest possible achievement in this national critical service.

Carolyn Varney, daughter of Mrs. Harold Clapp of Redmond, is the student editor of Panther Scratches and a member of Quill

and Scroll, national honorary for high school journalists. Mrs. Della Nance, journalism instructor at Redmond, is faculty adviser. Panther Scratches is printed monthly. "The Panther Scratches," wrote the judge in the National Scholastic Press association scorebook, "is a paper to which Redmond students and citizens can point with pride. You've put a lot of work and ability into it—and you've produced a good paper. It is a good testimony to the staff and faculty who have been active workers on the paper." First class rating was awarded the 1948 Panther Scratches. Second semester papers for this year

will be submitted for critical rating in May. Excellent ratings were given on news values and sources, news writing and editing, and department pages and special features and makeup. 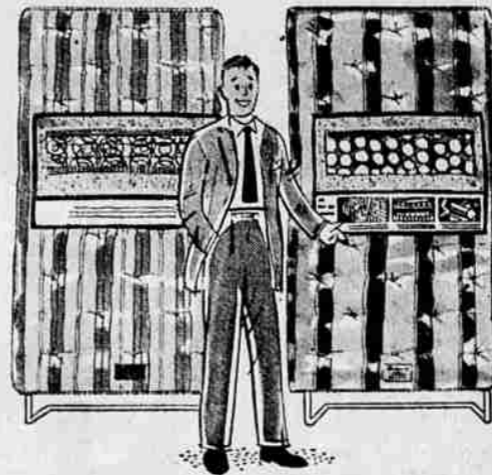
