

# Man Confesses Orgy of Murder in California

Eureka, Cal., July 6 (AP)—A merchant mariner admitted today that he bludgeoned two men to death in a wild orgy of murder but denied a young mother's charge that he raped her. The murder victims were Peter J. Flint, 27, and Peter Jensen, 53.

Henry Brun Gulbrandsen, 34, offered no motive for his crimes.

He was released only three weeks ago from the prison at Chino, Cal., where he served two years for stabbing a man 13 times with an icepick in a row over a woman.

Gulbrandsen, Brooklyn-born graduate of the maritime academy at New London, Conn., walked into a newspaper office yesterday and gave himself up.

**Object of Search**

He had been sought throughout the state since he went on his rampage Monday morning at Jensen's cabin, Candlelight lodge, in northern California's "Valley of the Moon."

"I did it," he told County detective Charles Cavagnero. "I did those murders. I'm the guy you're looking for."

But he denied that he raped Mrs. Eva Paget, 32, in the Fourth of July orgy.

Gulbrandsen said that when he awoke Monday at the cabin he was "feeling kind of groggy" from drinking the previous night but was not drunk. He said he had "rapid pulsation and pounding heartbeat."

He had been staying at the cabin with Flint, 27-year-old merchant marine lieutenant of Boyes Springs, Cal., and Jensen, who was chief landscape gardener at the Sonoma state home.

He gave no coherent reason why he beat in their skulls with the stone club, used by Indians for grinding grain, as they slept.

"I wandered out into the yard and found this stone grinder," he said. "I just went in and hit them."

"I felt no compassion at the time, but was in a kind of stupor."

## Embezzler Gets Prison Sentence

New York, July 6 (AP)—Richard A. Crowe, who stole \$883,660 in cash and bonds from a bank where he was a trusted official, was sentenced today to three years in jail.

Federal district judge Henry W. Goddard ordered that Crowe be placed on probation for five years after he completes his prison term.

Crowe, who was assistant manager of a downtown branch of the National City bank when he crammed the money and bonds in a suitcase last spring and fled to Florida, had pleaded guilty.

All but \$5,950.65 of the total was accounted for and restored to the bank. The bulk of it was found hidden in the banker's 14-room mansion on Staten Island.

For the first time in his numerous court appearances since he was arrested by the FBI at Daytona Beach Fla. last April, Crowe made an extended statement.

He complained that the sentence was too long because it would prevent him from attempting to restore the rest of the money he stole.

"I realize I've got to pay the bill," he told the judge, "but I don't see how I'm going to pay back any money by sitting around in prison. And I have my family to take care of... but I did something wrong."

"I am sorry I did it, your honor."

## 5 Meat Dealers Face Penalties

Portland, July 6 (AP)—A Multnomah county district judge yesterday found five Portland meat dealers guilty of violating a state statute, which holds that calves must be at least 28 days old before being placed on the market for sale.

Judge Frank E. Day upheld the Oregon statute as "entirely reasonable and therefore constitutional."

Found guilty were Morris Goldfoot and Warren Oster, Lincoln market; N. W. Andrews, Tigard Meat Co.; D. R. Hallett, Portland Produce Co.; Carl Rudeen, Portland Poultry and Meat Co.

**WORK STARTS ON BASE**

Portland, July 6 (AP)—Work was begun at the former Portland army air base yesterday to revitalize it as a new air force reserve training center.

The Wale-Campan Co. of Portland started work on a group of flood-damaged buildings which will become headquarters for the new air center, to be manned by 1500 officers and men.

**ORCAS HAS FIRE**

Orcas Island, Wash., July 6 (AP)—A spectacular wind-fanned fire destroyed a large general store, two warehouses and this island's only ferry slip and threatened to sweep through the tiny community of Orcas today before 100 coast guardsmen and volunteers finally brought the blaze under control.

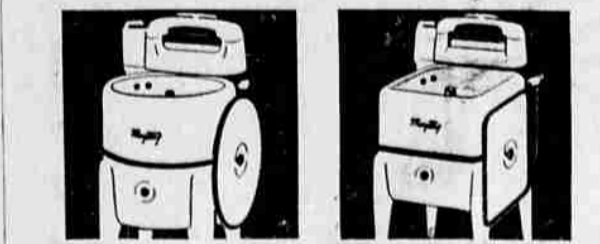
There were no injuries. Total damage was expected to exceed \$50,000.

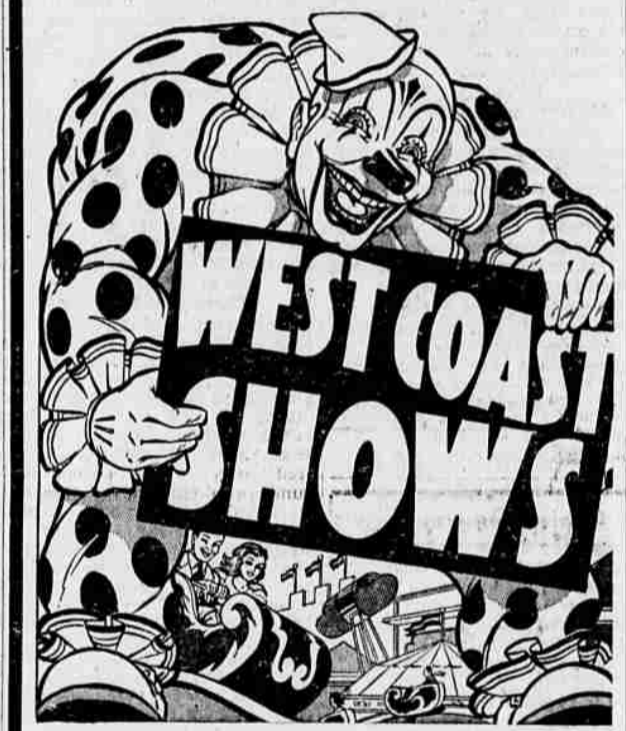
