

### Report Made On Quicksilver In Ochoco Area

A preliminary report on a geophysical survey in the Ochoco quicksilver district east of Prineville, has been released, according to an announcement recently made by W. E. Wrather, director of the geological survey.

Purpose of this study was to detect by use of geophysical methods subsurface geologic structures favorable to the concentration of deposition of mercury minerals.

The geophysics survey, made under the cooperative auspices of the U.S. geological survey and the U.S. bureau of mines, covers a strip approximately one mile long in the southwestern part of the Johnson creek fault area, and consists of a magnetic grid with traverse readings at 25-foot intervals across the fault zone. When correlated with the geology of the area, the geophysics data show a series of igneous dikes which apparently follow the zone of weakness of the Johnson creek fault system.

Copies of the report and accompanying maps have been placed on an open file in order to make this information immediately available to those interested. They can be inspected at the bureau of mines office, at Albany, or at the state department of geology and mineral industries office in Portland.
