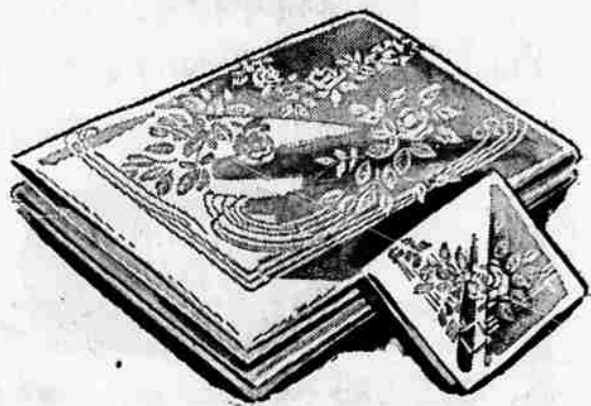

Widow Made Boss In Farmer's Will

Memphis, Tenn. AP—The late Carlo Gal, 69-year-old truck farmer, made it known in his will, who was to be "boss" at his death. His will, in Italian, was translated to read:

"... leave all of my stuff that belongs to me and my wife, Ernestine Gal. Leave to my children, all of them, \$5 a piece. After my death my wife is boss everything, land, the house and everything else I have. She is boss of all notes."

This matter came on for hearing before the County Court upon the petition of approximately 752 registered voters for the formation of a municipal corporation in the Northern portion of Deschutes County to be known as the "Central Oregon District Hospital" under the provisions of Chapter 548 of the Oregon Laws for 1949, the Court therefore made an order fixing Friday, December 9, 1949, at the Townsend Hall in the City of Redmond, as the time and place for holding an election for the purpose of voting on the question of establishing a municipal corporation to be known as the Central Oregon Hospital District within the boundaries described in said petition.

There being no further business, Court adjourned until Tuesday, November 15, 1949, at 10:00 o'clock A.M.
