## Stanford Beats Oregon Quintet By Close Margin

Eugene, Dec. 21 (AP)—Blonde George Yardley controlled the backboards and headed scoring honors here last night to lead his Stanford Indians to a 70-67 basketball win over the University of Oregon Webfoots before 4,100 fans.

Yardley ran up 15 points for the Cardinals in the first half and he added nine more points in the second half. He was especially sharp around the backboards and managed to out-manuever Web-foot players for control of the ball.

The game's outcome was based on offense play rather than tight defense as both teams raced across the floor.

Stanford clinched the contest during the last 75 seconds of the game, as Indian Jim Ramstead, Yardley and Gus Chavalas sank their free throws to break a 67-67 tie.

Stanford led during most of the game, but three minutes before the end, an Oregon rally, led by Jack Keeler and Bob Laxey, erased the Indians' 10-point lead and tied the score until the last minute free throws sank Oregon hopes.

Stanford held a 44-32 lead at halftime.

## Jim Bond, Author, Naturalist Will Make Bend Appearance

Jim Bond, author, naturalist and big game hunter, is to appear in Bend on the nights of Wednesday and Friday, Jan. 4 and 6 under auspices of local sportsmen's groups, it was announced today. In Bend, Bond will show his new big game picture, "Yukon Wilderness Wonderland", and lecture.

Bond, a former Bend resident and brother of U. S. Bond of this city, visited Bend last year and showed a film, "From Out of the Yukon," that attracted large crowds. A story of the past summer into the Yukon was made under auspices of the Canadian government.

Recently, Bond showed his Yukon picture in Roseburg and 2400 people were present.

Bond is author of "From Out of These Mountains," a story dealing with big game of the far north. His coming trip to Bend will be sponsored by the Izhak Walton League, the Deschutes County Sportsmen's association and the Bend chamber of commerce fish and game committee.

The author is also to appear in Redmond on Thursday, Jan. 5.

## Indiana Defeats Oregon Staters Again, 58 to 53

Corvallis, Dec. 21 (AP)—Indiana wound up a two-game basketball series here with Oregon State college last night by beating the Beavers, 58-53, before 3,395 fans to give the Hoosiers their second win in two nights and run their undefeated string to six games so far this year.

The teams battled through a tight first half with the lead changing back and forth. The game was tied up seven times before the half ended.

The Hoosiers grabbed their four-point 29-25 lead at the half as Tony Hill, Indiana forward, ran up six quick points within 10 minutes of the game's midway point.
