December 24 — We found water of the lake tolerably pure, and encamped at the farther end. There were some good grass and canes along the shore, and the vegetation at this place consisted principally of chenopodiaceous shrubs.

Mother, Five Children Lose Lives in Fire

San Antonio, Tex., Dec. 24 (AP)—A mother and five of her seven children died early today in a fire that destroyed their home and left the father and a sixth child critically burned.

A seventh child escaped unharmed. Firemen said Mrs. Maria Montelongo, 37, burned to death "like a flaming torch" on the lawn of the family's small three-room residence on San Antonio's west side.

She died as the flames killed the five children—Alejandro, 10; Andrea, 7; Yolanda, 5; Alicia, 4; and Carlos, 1. The husband, Ascencion, 36, was burned critically, as was 13-year-old Francisco, who suffered burns over 90 per cent of her body.

One Child Escapes

They said the eight members of the family had been "asleep in every room in the house" and

that several bodies were found "right alongside the stove."

Nine-year-old Josefina Montelongo, the only member of the family to escape unharmed, told firemen that she awoke and saw the fire and awakened her father.

The father, she said, roused the mother and tried to lead her out the front door. But it was locked, the girl said, and her father could not get it open.

Josefina said she managed to get the door open and run for help before her clothing ignited. By the time she could get neighbors to the scene, however, the freshly-painted house was almost solid flame.

The father, who was an unemployed truck driver, only yesterday had completed re-painting the home which he owned, the girl said.

She said the family Christmas tree was in the same room with the stove where Andrea, Yolanda and Alicia were asleep. The presents, however, were "hidden somewhere" in the house.

A search of the records indicated the 2:30 a.m. tragedy was the worst residential fire toll in the history of the city. Four persons were burned to death here Nov. 18 when fire destroyed another home in the south section of the city.
