Cloverdale, Calif., Dec. 24 (AP) — Two Coquille, Ore., persons were killed here last night en route to a Christmas gathering at Napa, Calif.

Mrs. Neva M. Helstead, 42, and her father, D. E. Brode, 73, both of Coquille, were killed when their car, driven by Mrs. Helstead's husband, Adam, 48, plunged down a 100-foot embankment. Helstead and a nephew, Harold Everdeen, 19, Myrtle Point, Ore., were pulled from the wreckage and taken to Healthburg General hospital. Neither was seriously injured.

State highway patrolman Larry Walker said the family was en route to visit Mrs. E. E. McConnell in Napa. A number of gaily wrapped Christmas packages were scattered around the wreckage.

Tax on 'Daylight Citizens' Sought

Portland, Dec. 24 (AP) — Mayor Dorothy McCullough Lee of Portland today said she will reintroduce an ordinance before the city council to require persons working in Portland but living outside the city limits to pay an annual license fee of \$25.

Mayor Lee estimated such an ordinance would yield about \$750,000 to help bolster a sagging city budget.

She said about 30 to 35,000 so-called "daylight citizens" could be taxed under the measure. Mayor Lee was opposed to a plan advanced by Finance Commissioner Ormand R. Bean which would cut city departments 10 per cent across the board.

She said such cuts would result in "sub-standard" service.

Young Geologist Survives Fall

Chico, Calif., Dec. 24 (AP) — A 25-year-old geology student survived today a 120-foot fall and slide down an abandoned mine shaft.

John K. Lewis, of Santa Ana, Calif., was rescued last night from the shaft after being imprisoned for an hour and 45 minutes. He suffered a broken ankle, a possible skull fracture and cuts and scratches from head to foot.

Lewis and his brother-in-law, W. C. Walker of Durham, Calif., started out yesterday to study rock formations in the Robbers Roost area in the Sierra foothills.

Walker said they discovered a lava cap and back under the cap a tunnel entrance to the shaft. Lewis went in with Walker's dog, Skipper. Walker heard a rumbling noise and the dog came running out.

Walker cautiously entered the tunnel and heard Lewis calling from the bottom of the nearly vertical shaft. He went to the nearby community of Plentz and got Jerry Mann and Ray Porter. They managed to get ropes down to Lewis and dragged him out.

He was treated by a Chico doctor and sent to bed at Walker's home.

Prineville Men Facing Charges On Morals Count

Prineville, Dec. 24 — Three Prineville young men ranging in age from 20 to 24 were arrested here yesterday on morals charges, following an investigation by city and state police extending over a period of about six weeks.

Arrested were Buddy Leo Puckett, 21, cited on a charge of contributing to the delinquency of a minor girl, aged 13; Calvin Royal Unger, 20, accused of attempted rape involving a 7-year-old girl; and Ray Reeves, 24, accused of contributing to the delinquency of a minor girl, aged 15.

Puckett was released on a \$500 bond and Unger on a \$1000 bond. Reeves is being held in the Crook county jail in lieu of a \$1000 bond. Officers said the cases were unrelated, and added that the investigation on local morals charges was being continued.

Jefferson County Has 12 Precincts

Madras, Dec. 24 — Mrs. Nellie Watts, Jefferson county clerk, has announced that reshuffling has given the county 12 instead of 11 precincts. Voters will poll their votes in the new arrangement of precincts for the first time at the next May election, and the county clerk has warned that registration, now necessary for eligibility in voting, must be made 30 days before the election. Registration books will close on April 19.

Formerly all residents of Madras and vicinity voted in a single precinct, which now has been divided in two, east Madras and west Madras. Two precincts replace the old Metolius district; a new one established for the Round Butte area. Willowcreek and Black Butte precincts have been merged with the Haystack precinct. The old Opal City precinct has been reestablished. It was formerly a part of Haystack.

The rearrangement will give Jefferson county the following official precincts, Mrs. Watts states:

Haystack, No. 1; Ashwood, No. 5; Kuteher, No. 6; Lyle Gap, No. 8; Opal City, No. 10; Metolius, No. 11; East Madras, No. 13; Warm Springs, No. 14; Camp Sherman, No. 16; Culver, No. 17; Round Butte, No. 18, and West Madras, No. 19.
