Dave Hoover Opens Campaign

Eugene, March 21 (AP)—Dave Hoover, of Deadwood in western Lane county, launched his campaign for the republican nomination for U. S. senator here last night before a crowd of about 125 persons at Eugene high school. Hoover, who operates a 400-acre farm on Deadwood creek near the Shuslaw river, criticized incumbent Sen. Wayne Morse for his "senatorial record of republican infidelity."

He said his own campaign motto was that of his party—"liberty against socialism."

"No real republican candidate should have to deviate from the declared policy of his own party, and rely on his own special, newly-concocted motto, unless he expects to use that motto as a post-election alibi, to hide behind, whenever he gets ready to assassinate the republican party."

Hoover extended criticism of Sen. Morse. Hoover said he would make a "forthright and unequivocal statement of principles on issues involved in this campaign at the proper time and place."

Fred E. Robinson, Medford clothier, who was first to file against Morse and who withdrew from the campaign a week ago, was on the platform with Hoover.

Student Plans Rugged Trip In Jungles

Fort Worth, Tex. (AP)—Dan Towns can advance written evidence that women aren't the so-called weaker sex.

Towns is a 25-year-old student at Texas Christian university and plans a 25,000-mile jeep expedition beginning Columbus day, October 12, at the farthestmost tip of South America—Magallanes, Chile.

Much of the estimated seven-month trip, which will take him up through South America, through the United States and in to Alaska, and back again to this country, is through uncharted jungle in South America.

Towns wants a woman to join him and three other men on the jaunt. A woman on the trip, he explained, will make "the whole thing more dramatic; it will make the pictures we expect to take a lot more salable."
