

Trygve Lie Plans Trip to Russia On U.N. Affairs

Lake Success, N. Y., April 13 (AP) — United Nations Secretary-general Trygve Lie indicated today he may make a flying trip to Moscow in an effort to break the east-west deadlock over China in the UN.

Lie has scheduled a tour of world capitals early next month. Although Moscow was not listed on his official itinerary, the Norwegian diplomat said in an informal conversation that the possibility of such a trip "is not excluded."

He intimated that he wanted to talk to Russian leaders on their home grounds about "things in general" as they affect the paralyzing deadlock between Russia and the western powers in the world organization. This would include the Russian demand that nationalistic China be ousted from the UN in favor of the Chinese communists.

Stalemate Continues

Russia has made recognition of Chinese Reds in the UN the price for returning to the UN groups from which Soviet delegates walked out in objection to the presence of Chinese nationalist members.

His definite travel plans call for Lie to sail for Europe on April 22. He will attend a meeting of the chiefs of the UN's specialized agencies at Paris on April 28 and will go on to Geneva for the opening of the world health organization session and cornerstone ceremonies at the WHO's building there on May 8. He hopes to visit the Hague, where the international court of justice sits, and London.

He will return to Lake Success before going to Montevideo, Uruguay, for the meeting of the economic commission for Latin America on June 5.

Evasion of Tax Brings Sentence

Chicago, April 13 (AP) — Carl Berns, 40, North Hollywood, Calif., pleaded guilty today and was sentenced to two years on a \$25,126 income tax evasion charge.

Berns was one of 11 alleged war profiteer tax dodgers indicted here last month. The two-count indictment originally charged evasion of \$43,654, but the government dismissed the first count covering 1944 income when Berns pleaded guilty to evading his 1945 tax.

Assistant U. S. attorney Robert Downing told the court that Berns, who never finished grammar school, ran an engineering firm and manufactured ventilator fans during the wartime shortage, sold his business in 1946 and moved to California.

Federal Judge Philip L. Sullivan denied a plea for probation.

Feeding Keeps Boys Busy

Wood Lake, Neb. (AP) — Four-H club youngsters in this northern Nebraska town are knee-deep in the cattle feeding business, thanks to the idea of a rancher, Harley Sullens.

Sullens was worried because there wasn't enough to occupy the after-school time of boys in the community. He was afraid their excess energy might be worked off "the wrong way."

So he evolved a plan under which ranchers have given their top calves to the boys. They, in turn, signed notes at the market price of the animals, and for feed.

With Sullens' guidance, they held box socials and sponsored other events to raise enough money to repair an old livery stable. Every cent of the money was earned. Sullens told the boys they would defeat the purpose of the project if they asked for donations.

Town members house their calves in the livery barn. Country boys and girls keep their animals at home, but bring them in to the stable on special days to show off their handiwork.

Every year, feeders from all parts of the middle west come to Cherry county to buy stock for their feed lots. Ranchers are enthusiastic about the 4-H project, which they say provides an ideal show place for their calves.

Portland, April 13 (AP) — An attempted holdup of the downtown Heathman hotel failed early today when a fast-thinking clerk told the would-be robber that no money was available.

Police nabbed Donald W. Phillips, 39, a half hour later in a taxi cab and jailed him on a charge of attempted robbery.

Frank O. Beckwith, hotel desk clerk, identified Phillips in a police lineup. He said Phillips entered the hotel, vaulted over the counter and, holding one hand in a pocket, demanded money. Beckwith told him none was available. Whereupon Phillips jumped back over the counter and said: "I'll be back with my buddies."

He was seen leaving in the taxi cab.

Boy Kills Three, Then Shoots Self

Huntington, W. Va., April 13 (AP) — An 18-year-old boy killed three members of his family with a hammer and a kitchen knife while they slept today and then shot himself through the head in a suicide attempt.

Police identified the dead as William Alexander Blanks, 47, his wife, Mildred, 40, and their daughter Mildred Brent, 10. The son, William Blanks Jr., was in critical condition at a hospital.

Police Detective Lt. A. T. Bryant said the youth attacked his parents and sister as they slept in their beds. He then set the house on fire and went out into the back yard and shot himself with a revolver.

No motive for the killings was determined immediately.

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
