Geology Students To Set Up Camp

On their way to the John Day basin, a region world-famous for its record of ancient life, Oregon State college geology students passed through central Oregon today, headed by Dr. W. D. Wilkinson, who will be in charge of a summer camp to be established near Picture gorge. Through the summer, the students will continue mapping the area and studying formations that date back to seas of the age of reptiles.

There will be some 25 students in the summer camp. In addition to the main camp, there will be a small party of advanced students working under Dr. Wilkinson in the Stupen country. In this group will be a Bend youth, Philip Brogan, who is taking graduate work in geology at O.S.C.

The University of Oregon is also to establish a summer geology camp in central Oregon, with Dr. Lloyd Staples in charge. That camp will be in the Horse Heaven area of Jefferson county, east of Madras. Now a member of the University of Oregon faculty, Dr. Staples for a number of years was geologist for the Sun Oil company in the mercury mining operations at Horse Heaven.

Prospectors Find Uranium, Entire Town in Dither

Houghton, Mich., June 13 (AP)—Two mystery prospectors who vanished after nearly breaking a Geiger counter with ore samples sent uranium fever soaring today in this community.

Every amateur and professional prospector in the area was all set to start digging for the supposedly super-radio active ore. But no one knew where to dig, and the two men who started the whole thing had simply disappeared.

Frank Goodman, 41, who runs a sporting goods store and newsstand in the bus station, said the men, clad in well-worn army fatigues, showed up yesterday and asked him to test some rock samples with his Geiger counter. He said their pockets were bulging with rocks.

"I told them it would cost them a quarter for each rock I tested," Goodman said. "One of them sort of smiled and dug around in his pocket and came up with a rock about five by four inches, the biggest one he had."

Very Active

"I thought the counter was going to pop," Goodman said. "The neon tube flashed so much that it looked like one steady light. It just kept on buzzing and flashing without stopping."

He said the rock was "lots more active" than several radio active samples from Colorado he uses to demonstrate the counter.

"I told the fellows they really had something," Goodman said. "I asked them where they got the rocks, but they told me they 'just aren't talking.' I asked them to wait until I could tell a reporter about them, but they said they didn't want any publicity."

"Then they just turned around and walked out of the station," Goodman said. "Not that I blame them. I wouldn't want the whole town following me around either."

News of the discovery spread quickly through this town of 5,000 on the northernmost thrust of Michigan's upper peninsula.
