North Koreans were pressing their offensive along the front below Suwon. But it mentioned movements toward Osan, 11 miles south of Suwon, which long since had been overrun by the communists. A new threat to the advanced American positions, now several miles south of Pyongyang and within 50 miles of the provisional capital of Taejon, was indicated by MacArthur's communique. It said the South Koreans still held Chungju, 47 miles east of Pyongyang. Chungju is a transport hub commanding the main lines between Pusan and the battlefield. The North Koreans were massing strength in the Samechok area on the coast, 56 miles east of Chungju, and were striking out inland to an undetermined depth. Flank Laid Open At the same time the U. S. retreat through Pyongyang laid open that flank of the Pusan-Chungju transport artery, setting up a possible communist pincer drive to choke off the flow of U. S. men and supplies. A vital rail line runs northwest from the port of Pusan to Chungju. MacArthur reported a general movement of North Korean troops, artillery, tanks and supplies southward through the Seoul-Suwon area in a big scale reinforcement. Communist forces which captured the Seoul port of Inchon also were moving down through Suwon toward the front. The communique reported a coordinated assault by communist tanks and infantry on U. S. positions. At least four communist tanks were knocked out by point blank artillery fire. United States troops withdrew after the action to a rendezvous for regrouping and reorganization," the communique said. It apparently referred to the U.
