## Military Heads

The two bills approved today were the manpower measure asked for by President Truman in his Korean crisis message to congress Wednesday.

The house will vote on both next Tuesday. The senate schedule was not disclosed immediately, but early action and passage seemed certain.

Senate committee approval of the two bills was unanimous. In the house group, Rep. Harry L. Towse, R. N. J., cast a lone vote against them. He said he would oppose them "until they (defense officials) say what they are going to do."

Brig. Gen. C. V. R. Schuyler, chief of the army's planning branch, told the house committee the call for more fighting men was decided upon by the joint chiefs of staff. He said the joint chiefs also agreed that possible developments in Korea or elsewhere could mean a further "upward revision" on short notice.

**To Reopen Camps**  
He added that there are tentative plans for reopening some world war II army camps, but he did not say which ones.

Under the present draft law, only men 19 through 25 are subject to induction and veterans of the past war are exempt, except in cases of men who served less than three months.

Schuyler said the army can equip all the men it needs for training purposes, but will have to buy "in some categories" to make them ready for battle.

The fighting services already had their mobilization program in high gear to provide reinforcements for the hard-pressed American forces in Korea.

The marines yesterday called up all their organized reserve ground units—47,000 officers and men—while the army alerted an undisclosed number of regular units for far eastern duty, and the navy ordered "several" of its organized air reserve squadrons back on active duty immediately.

An early call for national guard units also was expected momentarily.

There are 332,000 in the national guard ground units. The units are composed of 25 infantry divisions, two armored divisions, 20 regimental combat teams, plus 1,286 assorted units of varying size. These extra units include anti-aircraft, field artillery and medical specialists.

Guard officials said they are ready to provide whatever the joint chiefs of staff ask for, but they hoped no regular divisions would be broken up.

**Orders Written Up**  
Army, navy and air force spokesmen said orders are being written up as rapidly as possible for the recall of individuals and units needed to bring the services up to planned strength. Reservists will be "permitted" to complete a minimum of one year in uniform, they said.

The armed forces for the first time since the outbreak of the Korean war were calling married men, some with children. One defense spokesman said the reserve units "unquestionably" include some married men who will be called along with single men.

None of the services would say exactly how many men were involved in the latest defense moves.

But it was known that the marines' organized ground reserves totaled 47,000 officers and men. The first division, en route to the far east, numbers about 7,000 men, contrasted with wartime strength of 23,000.

The army alerted "combat and support" units in each of the six army areas, but it did not identify them. It said only that they will be moved to the far east "in the near future."

The recall of naval air squadrons will permit the navy to strengthen various missions, but spokesmen refused to say exactly how they would be used. The first air group called by the navy was a Chicago combat unit. It was ordered to report this morning for training at the Glenview naval air station.

**MORE SHIPS CALLED**  
Portland, July 21 (UP)—Four more victory ships have been ordered back to service from the Astoria, Ore., reserve fleet and will come to Swan Island here for repairs.

The four ships to be returned to war service by the military sea transport service were reported to be the Council Bluffs, Ocala, China and Swarthmore. Seven other victory-type vessels have already been taken from the Astoria mothball fleet.
