

Redmond Board Expanded to Nine

Redmond, Dec. 21 — A new set-up for the chamber of commerce directors was voted upon favorably at the chamber luncheon meeting Tuesday noon. Instead of six directors, the board will be composed of nine. The chamber president and vice-president will be elected by the directors.

Five directors will be elected at the next meeting from 10 names presented at Tuesday's meeting by the nominating committee which was composed of Joe Brown, Roy Newell and M. W. Pearson. Holdover directors are Darrell Smith and Roy Carpenter who will serve for one more year each, and Jay Shively and C. E. Thompson who have two years to serve. Under the new system two directors will be elected each year to replace the two who go off the board.

Chamber offices will be set up the first of the year at the Darrell Smith building with Harold C. Clapp in charge as full-time secretary.

Kenneth Munkres, who is in charge of the residential lighting contest, announced that signs have been made which will be placed at the sites of the first, second and third prizes. The contest is to be judged Friday evening.

Howard Schroeder, chairman of the merchants committee, asked for volunteers to assist with the sacking of treats which are to be handed out to children at the annual Christmas program for children on Saturday morning.

Darrell Smith was appointed as a representative of the chamber to serve on a civic committee.

Spanish Treasure Probably Found in Scottish Waters

London (U.P.)—The Duke of Argyll and his company of adventurers believe they may be running their hands through mounds of golden ducats next spring.

They are now cautiously certain that they really located a sunken treasure ship of the Spanish armada last summer.

In a small apartment in London, final plans are being made to raise the hulk at the first possible moment and extract from its strong rooms the £3,000,000 (\$8,400,000) in gold and other valuables believed aboard when it exploded and sank in Tobermory bay, Scotland, in 1588.

Experts Not Sure
Other experts are not as certain as the Duke of Argyll and his staff. A leading Scottish archivist has quoted a letter written by the master mariner of the armada which indicates the ship in Tobermory bay was only a merchant vessel and not the treasure galleon Almirante (or Duque) de Florencia.

The experts, the optimistic adventurers say, haven't had the chance to study a small plank ripped loose from the hulk by royal navy divers.

The plank is of African teak, a wood far too valuable for use on ordinary ships, in the opinion of the treasure hunters.

Also, one of the cannon salvaged by an earlier expedition was an exquisite weapon forged by the great Benvenuto Cellini.

"Further," a member of the expedition said, "Sir Francis Walsingham, Queen Elizabeth's secret service chief, described her as 'a ship of great value' in his reports. We believe the money aboard was for paying the armies of the Duke of Parma, then in Holland preparing to invade Britain. That's why Sir Francis's intelligence was interested in what she was carrying."

Navy in on Hunt
Last summer the Duke of Argyll spent about £4,000 (\$11,200) in locating the hulk. The royal navy undertook the job as an exercise, using all modern methods including diving, sweeping and echo sounding.

The salvage job will be equally scientific and much more expensive. Thick layers of silt must be removed and then experts will determine whether to try to remove the treasure on the sea bed or haul the ancient wreck to the surface.

The treasure hunt has turned up the fascinating possibility that the galleon was not sunk by enemy action. An irate Scottish merchant apparently fired the powder magazine because he had not been paid for his wares.

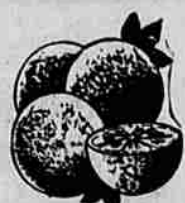
