Redmond, June 21 — Because of the weatherman and dozens of panting children, the city of Redmond was forced to open its pool two days sooner than the scheduled opening. A Redmond mother hired a life guard to be on hand Friday, and 130 small fry plunged into the cool waters. On Saturday the count was 158, with the busiest day being Tuesday with 272 buying swim tickets. A total of 1106 tickets were sold the first four days. To date 49 grade school season tickets have been sold and eight high school.

Frank Stranahan
Golf Medalist

South Bend, Ind., June 21 (UP)—Frank Stranahan, who shot a sizzling five under par to take medalist honors in the 49th Western Amateur Golf tournament, today meets Edward Conklin in the first round of match play.

Stranahan, a double winner in the Western amateur, blazed the way in qualifying rounds with a one under par in the first 18 and then improved to four under regulation to wind up the preliminary rounds.

The soggy course, wetted by Tuesday's rain, made no difficulties for the Toledo, O., millionaire as he shot six birdies and 10 pars to outclass the starters.

Conklin, a Bloomington, Ill., golfer, shot 153, five strokes over Stranahan's score, in the opening rounds of the tourney on the tricky course at the South Bend country club.

Only one stroke behind the Toledo ace in the opening rounds of play was Dale Morey, Dallas, Tex., who shot 149 to take runners up honors. Morey, originally from Martinsville, Ind., is one of the leading amateurs in the southwest.

Ball Game

Bend and Redmond baseball teams of the Central Oregon league were principals here last night in a benefit game for Marvin Scott, injured Redmond union high school coach, and entertained with one of the best contests of the year—a game that netted close to \$200 locally for Scott. At the time of his serious injury on June 10, Scott was manager of the Redmond baseball team, and last year played for the Moose.
