Vandals Maintain Slim Hope With Win Over Beavers

CORVALLIS, Ore., Feb. 13 (AP)—Idaho still maintained some hope Wednesday of winning the Northern Division basketball title after an exciting 46-43 victory over Oregon State Tuesday night.

The win gave the Vandals a split in their "suicide swing" through the Willamette valley. They could win the division title only by beating Washington twice at Moscow this weekend and then winning a final pair against Oregon. But the Huskies would still have to co-operate by dropping one of their final pair against Washington State.

Center Hartley Kruger guided the Vandals' Tuesday night win with 22 points.

The Vandals led 11 to 9 at the end of the first period, but OSC scored 17 points in the second to lead at the half, 26-22. After that they were tied at 27-27, 32-32 and 42-42.

With a little more than two minutes to play, Oregon State Center Bob Edwards put the Beavers ahead, 43-42, on a free throw. But after a tip-in by Kruger for Idaho, Forward Harland Melton put the contest on ice by stealing the ball and taking it for a lay-in.

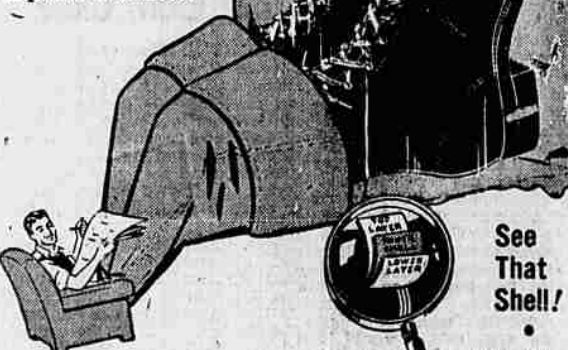
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
