

Given for Rape

PRINEVILLE, Feb. 20-James Mellor, 45, pleaded guilty to two charges of statutory rape, Tues-day in a special session of circuit court. Judge R. S. Hamilton sen-tenced him to a total of 50 years in the state pentientiary, with 30-year and 20-year charges for the two offenses to run consecutive-iv.

The morals charges involve two minor stepchildren, daughters of his wife. He was specifically charged with acts which occurred Dec. 15, 1951, and Jan. 20, 1952. Mellor was an itinerant agricul-ture worker, and had lived in the Melrose Acres area. He was tak-en to the state penitentiary at Salem today, in custody of Sher-lif Ralph Jordan and State Po-lice Officer Vernon Boyer.




