

Red Resistance On Kojie Island Declared at End

KOJIE ISLAND, Korea, June 13 (AP)—Brig. Gen. Haydon L. Bull Boatner claimed victory Friday in the bloody "little war" to regain control of this island's 80,000 Communist prisoners.

"The thing is over," he said. Boatner, tough combat veteran who took command a month ago after prisoners kidnapped Brig. Gen. now Col. Francis T. Dodd, walked unarmed among recently belligerent Reds inside a new compound.

Reds Convinced

He broke the back of Communist resistance Tuesday when paratroopers of the 187th Airborne regiment stormed Compound 76. Savage hand to hand fighting left one American soldier and 39 prisoners dead and 150 prisoners wounded.

The North Korean officers of Compound 66 surrendered in smart military fashion Friday and were hauled off to new enclosures where heavily armed American, British and Canadian troops stood by, ready for a fight if necessary.

The 5,000 civilian internees in Compound 62, where one American and 87 prisoners died in a Feb. 18 riot, sent a note to Boatner saying simply, "We are ready to move."

Will Leave Warning

These were the last two compounds in which serious resistance was feared. Boatner's men are breaking up the compounds holding up to 6,000 men each into 500-man sections.

All empty compounds will be cleaned up except No. 76, Boatner said. It will remain as a warning to the Reds.

Boatner claimed victory when the leader of the 2,700 North Korean officers stepped up to him, handed him a North Korean flag, saluted and stepped back into ranks.

The general returned the salute and pocketed the flag. The prisoners marched obediently to trucks waiting to haul them to their new compounds.

Jackson County Suffers Heavy Loss From Cold

MEDFORD, June 13 (AP)—Fruit growers and horticulturists here tried Friday to assess damage done to the \$14,000,000 pear industry in Jackson county by Wednesday night's unprecedented frost.

County Agent C. B. Cordy said the county's tomato, bean, cucumber and other truck crops were practically wiped out when temperatures dropped to an official 31 degrees with reports of 26 degrees in the coldest spots.

Worst on Record

The cold snap was the most severe for a June 12 ever recorded by the Medford weather bureau. Cordy said it would take several days to estimate the dollar damage to the pear crop but that it would be heavy. Most valley orchardists had taken in smudge pots after the end of May, normally the end of the frost danger season. A few of the orchard heating services were still in use in some orchards and were lighted during the night.

COLD CONTINUES

Below-freezing temperatures were reported in central and eastern Oregon again Thursday night, but the weather warmed up in the Rogue river valley where crops were damaged by frost Wednesday night.

Meanwhile the sun broke through in Portland and partly cloudy skies instead of rain graced the big Rose Festival parade.

Baker had the coldest official temperature early Friday with 30. Other below-freezing points were Klamath Falls, La Grande and Lakeview with 31 and Bend with 32. Medford had 39, Pendleton 40, Portland 42, North Bend 46 and The Dalles 50.

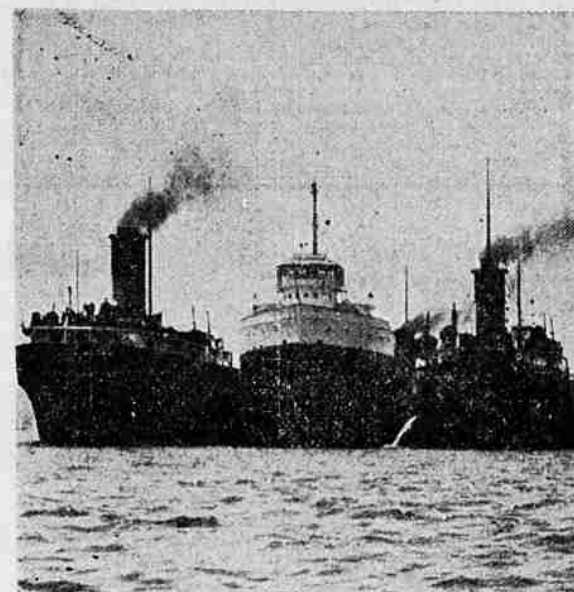
Improving weather conditions were forecast for Saturday, although more frost was expected Friday night east of the Cascades.

France Cracking Down on Leaders Of Communists

PARIS, June 13 (AP)—"Strong man" Antoine Pinay is preparing to ban Communists and fellow travelers from high army and government posts, reliable sources said Friday.

Pudgy Communist leader Jacques Duclos warned angrily at the same time that if the government keeps up its anti-Red crackdown its leaders may some day face trial as "war criminals." Government sources said Pinay and his advisers are drafting a law by which all Reds would be kept out of top army, navy,

air force and government jobs. A bill incorporating the law will be introduced in Parliament, informants said.

Duclos, jailed last month-end for inciting riots against Gen. Matthew B. Ridgway, underwent the second day of questioning before examining magistrate Pierre Jacquinet Friday.

"There is a strange similarity between the government's charges against me and those against the German Communists in the Reichstag fire trial," Duclos told Jacquinet. "Remember what happened to Goering."

The Nazis under Goering burned the Berlin Parliament building in 1933 and blamed it on the Communists. Goering, convicted as a war criminal, cheated the gallows by committing suicide.

Grangers Reject Anti-Communist Teachers' Oath

LA GRANDE, June 13 (AP)—A resolution seeking an anti-Communist oath for all Oregon school teachers was rejected here Thursday by the Oregon State Grange. Vote to reject the proposal was nearly unanimous.

The action followed a statement by Dr. Rod G. Langston, president of Eastern Oregon College of Education, saying the oath would not eliminate Communists from schools.

Delegates also voted to join with the Oregon Council of Churches in opposing pari-mutuel betting in the state.

Gambling Opposed

Although part of the revenue from horse and dog race betting goes to county fairs, the Grangers resolved to support the initiative measure being sponsored by the church group to outlaw race track gambling.

The delegates chose Medford as their 1953 convention site and voted to oppose the efforts of consumer organizations to decontrol wholesale and retail milk prices.

A recommendation by State Master Elmer McClure for an intensive effort to put the mandatory standard time bill on the November ballot was approved and the grange will ask legislation to transfer the tax collecting functions of county sheriffs to county treasurers.

The convention also set its sights on highway billboards, branding them as "highway pollution" that is not good for the tourist industry.

Doctors Disagree With Hershey

CHICAGO, June 13 (AP)—Five doctors attending the American Medical Association convention disagreed Friday with Draft Director Lewis B. Hershey that the health of the nation's youth is on the down-grade.

Hershey said that 45 per cent of the men eligible for military service had been turned down for physical, mental or moral reasons during the past four years. The health of the nation's youth, Hershey told a congressional committee, "not only has shown no improvement, but is less favorable" now than it was during World War II.

The doctor said the high rejection rate was due to: illiteracy rather than poor health, and overly high standards set by the services themselves.

Two of the doctors said Hershey's statement was simply a plug for "socialized medicine" by trying to convince the public that the nation's health was slipping.

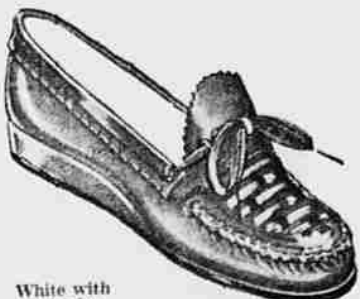
