Veep Too Old, Unions Decide

CHICAGO, July 21 (UP)—AFL and CIO spokesmen met with Vice President Alben W. Barkley Monday to break the news that he is not their presidential candidate, but left the Veep's headquarters without comment.

Ten union officials had breakfast with Barkley and talked with him and his aides for about an hour and a half. At the conclusion of the meeting they brusquely turned aside reporters and said they will issue a statement later today.

Pressed for information on the session, Jack Kroll, director of the CIO Political Action Committee, angrily advised reporters to "be your age."

The labor spokesmen did not even say they informed the vice president of their decision to withhold support from his presidential campaign because he is too old.

Barkley himself issued a short statement saying that he "enjoyed" meeting with the labor group and discussing labor problems. He said he would have no further comment.

An hour after the meeting labor sources reported that the AFL-CIO spokesmen did not back down during their talk with the vice president. The labor stand against Barkley was reported to be unchanged after the session.

Hungarian Red Reveals Tactics Against Church

LONDON (UP)—In a review of the Communists' post-war fight for supreme power in Hungary, the veteran Communist leader and general party secretary, Matyas Rakosi, revealed the tactics used by the Communists to break down the influence of the Catholic church.

In an article in the Communist party monthly, Social Review, Rakosi described how his party attacked the church and destroyed its power under the pretext that it was harboring "reactionary elements."

The campaign against the church came only after the Communists had succeeded in compromising and destroying the largest Hungarian political organization, the Smallholders' party, and in splitting and absorbing the Socialists.

In addition, the Communists had brought under their control the security police and their trade unions. Only after having thus prepared the ground did they attempt to attack the Christian churches and the Catholic church as the last in the long list of organizations which they had marked for destruction.

Campaign Described In Rakosi's own words, the Communists' campaign against the churches developed as follows: "The winning over (by the Communists) of the masses of peasants, the small bourgeoisie and, in certain places, even of the industrial workers was rendered extremely difficult by the reaction hiding behind the cloak of the church.

"The majority of the church leaders were opposed to democracy from the very first moment. This opposition was particularly sharp on the part of the Catholic church, whose lands were taken away by the land reform. The churches fought almost united against us from 1945 to 1948.

"First of all we broke up the reactionary united front of the churches. By making use of the democratic possibilities in the Reformed, Calvinist and the Evangelical Lutheran churches, we were able to mobilize the believers who sympathized with us. An agreement was reached in 1948 in the spirit of mutual understanding and indulgence which ensured the peaceful co-existence of the people's democracy and these churches.

Attack Organized Having thus eliminated the Protestants from the fight, the Communists proceeded to make a frontal attack on the Catholic church, by far the greatest spiritual power in Hungary.

"The position with the Catholic church was different," Rakosi went on. "The leaders of this church maintained close relations with the American imperialists, by order of the Vatican.

"After the unmasking of the Smallholders' party as the agents of the American imperialists, the Social Democratic party was ordered to man the front line. When the treacherous Social Democratic leaders have shared the same fate—that is to say when the Commu-
